WHEN THE WEATHER WARMS UP, IT'S TEMPTING TO DRESS LIGHTLY. KEEP SUNSCREEN IN YOUR VEHICLE AND STAY HYDRATED BY DRINKING PLENTY OF WATER THROUGHOUT THE DAY, IN ALL TYPES OF WEATHER.

SPRINGTIME OFTEN MEANS THE START OF LANDSCAPING AND EXCAVATION PROJECTS, BOTH ON AND OFF THE JOB. THIS MEANS JOBSITE INGRESS & EGRESS CAN CHANGE FROM DAY TO DAY. REVIEW EVACUATION ROUTES AND EMERGENCY PROCEDURES WITH YOUR COWORKERS AND FAMILY MEMBERS, INCLUDING FIRST AID KIT LOCATIONS, AND EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION. IF DOING WORK FROM HOME, ALWAYS REMEMBER TO CALL 8-1-1 BEFORE YOU DIG, NO MATTER THE SIZE OF THE PROJECT.
